# 2 Candidates for President

## 2.1 Lizzie Nabney

I am running for president because I want to give back to a team which has given me so much over the last five years. Being on A-team for two years and serving as your treasurer this year have put me in a unique position to understand current team operations and inspired me to continue in a leadership role.

When I became treasurer, the team had been operating at an unsustainable loss for several years. This year, I turned our finances around, raising over \$15,000 in grants which I used to benefit current team members. I put over \$10,000 into competition subsidies, including introducing a new subsidy for Arnold registration. I increased lesson subsidies by 10% this semester, saving team members thousands of dollars. As president, I will mentor the new treasurer so the team can continue these increased subsidies. I also went far beyond the requirements of my own role, helping extensively with MichComp, covering team teaching at short notice and dedicating hours to mentoring newcomers every week.

The biggest challenge facing the team next year is defending our national title, since Arnold was closely contested. I intend to improve OSB attendance by increasing registration subsidy, and I want to encourage couples to compete in American styles by offering extra American lessons. I value the team as a supportive community which helped me through tough times in graduate school and I would be honoured to serve as your president to help our team continue to be fantastic next year!

# 2.2 Saharsh Hajela

Thank you for these past four years – I would be honored to serve as our team President!

Being a member of A team this year helped me realize that being a good dancer doesn't always overlap with competitive success. I've personally experienced the frustration of being cut from the first round of Bronze Latin after months of hard work. My primary focus as president will be to support the team competitively. This also includes building relationships with other teams to explore new
